## MADAME PRESIDENT: THE COVER THAT NEVER WAS

If Kamala Harris had won.

The portrait above, "Kamala," painted by Kadir Nelson, would have been the cover of the November 18, 2024, issue of *The New Yorker*—that is, if Kamala Harris had won the election on November 5th. Instead, late that evening, when it became clear that the vote was going the other way, it was <u>swapped out</u> for a silhouette of soon-to-be President Donald Trump, drawn quickly by Barry Blitt (who is also the artist behind the January 20, 2025, cover about the Inauguration).

This is not the first would-be Madame President cover in the magazine's history; the first was, of course, in 2016, when a <u>cover of Hillary Clinton</u> was replaced by a <u>cover of a wall</u>. Though this image of Vice-President Harris never made it onto newsstands, the original painting will be on view at an exhibition of *New Yorker* covers at <u>L'Alliance New York</u>, which opens on January 21st and runs through March 30th.
